

ABOUT SPECIALTY WEEK

Trail to Eagle is the highlight program offered during Camp Marriott's Specialty Week. In addition to a modified regular program, participants engage in activities, Merit Badges, and other offerings based on the program theme.

Specialty Week is traditionally largely attended by provisional Scouts (attending individually), but is also open to those attending with their unit.

There is no minimum rank requirement to attend, but Trail to Eagle is recommended for Scouts ages 13 and up.

Specialty Week is July 28th to August 4th, 2018.

The cost is \$400 due by May 18th. Save \$40 if paid by April 13th and get a free Goshen hat.

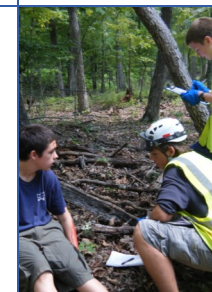

MERIT BADGE PROGRAM

Participants have the opportunity to earn up to six Merit Badges from a wide range of options. Our schedule includes a large selection of Eagle-required Merit Badges—from Camping to Citizenship in the Community—plus fun and valuable electives—from Kayaking to Forestry.

Many of the Eagle-required badges involve doing some work beforehand in the way of prerequisites. Be sure to check our program guide (found on our website) for prerequisites and our Merit Badge Program Schedule.



ATTEND AS AN INDIVIDUAL OR WITH A GROUP OF FRIENDS

As a provisional Scout, we'll place you in one of our provisional Troops for the week, which will function like your unit at home. You'll form patrols, live, cook, complete site chores, and participate in activities together.

Instead of your normal Scoutmasters, Troops are supervised by camp staff and adult volunteers. You'll be electing patrol leaders in your patrol once you arrive.
