Sharpen your outdoor skills at Scoutcraft. Shoot shotgun, archery, and rifle at Shooting Sports. Learn about plants, wildlife, environments, and conservation at Ecology.



Want More?

While part of your crew learns the skills, you can test yours out next door—at Lenhok'sin High Adventure. Spend a week backpacking and stopping at outposts to engage in adventure activities, like caving or black powder shooting. Ranger Experience allows Venturers to build their own program. Some program options—like BSA Lifeguard—will take the whole week, while others can be combined to create your own experience. Learn about the sport of fishing and try to catch fish from Lake Merriweather, go boating and have fun with watercraft, learn about the natural world and more.

Avoid Excessive Tabletop Displays

Learn advanced skills and help out the camp staff by teaching a skill or giving a presentation to the Boy Scouts learning about the same topics in their Merit Badges.

Just for Fun

Hang out with your friends in free swim or open boating. Test your accuracy at free shoot, with archery, rifle, or shotgun. Get crafty at handicraft. Go on an adventure with the Canoeing Overnighter canoe across the lake, go rappelling, and then camp out. Make the hike to Viewing Rock and see the Reservation and the lake from up high. Challenge other Crews and Troops—whether it's during Trivia Night at Eagle's Eyrie or during the campwide games on Friday afternoon.
