Sunday Arrival Notes

- When you get on the road, please have one adult text our Admin phone letting us know your troop number and your ETA. This number will be posted on gotogoshen.org one week before the start of the summer.
- Please do not arrive earlier or later than the noon-1pm arrival window. Please note that lunch is not provided on Sunday and your troop should pack lunches and eat them before arriving.
- Ensure that your entire troop arrives at the same time. If you are caravaning or separate parents are dropping off their children, please coordinate to all arrive at the same time. We recommend pulling over somewhere close to Goshen to regroup your caravan.
- Wait times are to be expected at the medical and swim checks. We are always looking at how we can optimize this process and we will get through everybody as quickly as possible. BSA policy dictates that the med check must be done before the swim check.
- Your troop will be escorted to your campsite by your Site Guide. The Site Guide will give you time to unload your packs, but this is not when time will be given to unpack and make camp. The Site Guide will get the troop started on the tour as quickly as possible and time will be given to set up camp later in the afternoon after all other arrival tasks are taken care of. Cars can be driven to campsites (at your own risk) to unload gear but they must be returned to the main parking lot before the Opening Campfire.
