- Participants will be grouped with others in the Phoenix Nest Program to form one “Pack” for the Week
- This Pack will do activities together, share a campsite, and eat together in the dining hall

Frequently Asked Questions

Which kind of Camp is the best fit for my scout?

What age groups are in your pack?

- Rising Tigers – Rising AOL Scouts: Day Camp, Camp Snyder
- Rising Webelos and Rising AOL Scouts: Camp Ross (GSR)

What program length are you looking for?

- Day Time Programs: Day Camp (District and Camp Snyder)
- Overnight Opportunities: Camp Snyder (Resident Weekend), Camp Ross (GSR)
- Week-long Program: Camp Ross (GSR)

What are the adult requirements for each Camp?

- District Day Camps

- Pack must provide leadership and adult supervision (including transportation)
- At least one (1) registered adult for every five (5) Cub Scouts. At least two adults must be present per YPT.
- Rising Tigers must be accompanied by their Tiger Partner (parent).

- Camp Snyder

- Pack must provide leadership and adult supervision (including transportation)
- At least one (1) registered adult for every five (5) Cub Scouts. At least two adults must be present per YPT.

- Camp Ross (GSR)

- Pack must provide leadership and adult supervision (including transportation)
- At least one (1) registered adult for every four (4) Cub Scouts. At least two adults must be present per YPT.
- Splitting Adults on one registration

 - Parts A and B of Annual Health and Medical Record

 - Parts A, B, and C of Annual Health and Medical Record
 - NCAC Health Advisory Form
