Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

1. When should I arrive?

We recommend arriving Friday evening, beginning at 5:00 pm, although some arrive early Saturday morning. The Service Weekend officially begins at 8:00 am, Saturday morning.

2. Where do I sleep?

Participants are encouraged to "camp out" for the weekend in their own tents at Camp Post or Camp Olmsted, however other housing is available in the Gray's Lodge Bunk Room and select Camp Post cabins. Hot water is available at Gray's Lodge.

3. Where should I go when I arrive?

If arriving Friday night, please join us at Gray's Lodge at Camp Post for fellowship with other GSR Alumni and event attendees.

If arriving Saturday morning before 9:00 am, please join us at Gray's Lodge at Camp Post to receive your project assignment and meet your work group.

If arriving anytime Saturday morning after 9:00 am, please go to Gray's Lodge and contact the Reservation Director, Elisabeth Warren, who can assist in pairing you with a work group.

4. Where / when do people eat during the weekend?

6. What tools should I bring?

Note: Do not bring a chainsaw unless you are BSA chainsaw certified and have arranged with the coordinators.
